Your Current ABIM MOC Program Status

Your certification(s) are valid indefinitely as long as you hold a current and valid license.

What do I need to do to be reported as "Meeting MOC Requirements"?

- In January 2014, go to Physician Login at www.abim.org and enroll in MOC.
 - If you do not log in and activate your program by March 31, 2014, you will be reported as "Certified, Not Meeting MOC Requirements." After March 31, 2014, you can change your reported status to "Meeting MOC Requirements" by simply logging in and enrolling in the program.
- In January 2014, check your MOC Status Report to see your program requirements.
- Begin earning MOC points:
 - By December 31, 2015 and every two years thereafter, complete at least one ABIM-approved MOC activity to earn points.
 - By December 31, 2018 and every five years thereafter, earn 100 points distributed across key areas: medical knowledge and practice assessment. In addition, you will need to fulfill a patient safety and a patient survey requirement.
 - The points earned every two years count toward the five-year requirement.
- Pass the exam for your certification that is valid indefinitely by December 31, 2023.

If you choose not to participate in the program or if you miss a milestone, you will not lose your certification(s) that are valid indefinitely, but ABIM will report you as "Certified, Not Meeting MOC Requirements."
